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Teaching and Learning (Strategic, Annual Goals)

Mathematics Curriculum Refresh

- The school has been approved by the MOE to access the university to provide maths PLD to support the implementation of the Years 0-8 maths curriculum, yet to be scheduled at their end.
- Prime Maths has been running in school now for a little over 3 weeks, as with any new initiative we are working through the challenge and learning around a new system to support the new curriculum.
- The cross class teaching time is working well, staff are positive about the increased time they have with the students working
 at the level of the books they use rather than multiple groups with shorter lengths of time with the learners.
- Staff like the new prime math planning tool that aligns with the prime books.
- We have identified 3 key concerns with the current thinking of the government for math delivery as stated in this snippet from
 the Minister
 Should students all use different books depending on their ability? We are encouraging
 - a 'whole class teaching model' where all students benefit from teaching at their year level against the refreshed curriculum. Additional material (be it support or extension to provide differentiated learning) are best determined by you as the classroom teacher. Should you require a different workbook to support this then it is my expectation that you can order it through Down the Back of the Chair.

Concerns

- Ability to extend learners or accelerate students who are below "expected year level"
- o 5 year old entry to school staggered vs "cohort" when starting the Prime programme.
- During a recent principal Professional learning retreat We had opportunities to address these concerns with Curriculum advisors and Waikato director of education, MOE. As a profession we are seeing a significant shift in the approach to teaching and learning which is applied in the new curriculum alongside the universal design for learning these documents are adopting.

Next Steps

- Have all the students set up with Math pro the online tool to support the programme
- Continue to visit and revisit our implementation and review to fine tune the "Puahue Way" as we address areas that require extra attention or consideration.

English Curriculum Refresh

- The senior leadership team were invited to attend workshops with Dr Helen Walls on the English Curriculum. She was one
 of the 6 authors of the document.
- Structured Literacy (SL) MOE PLD for the school 4 staff (senior school and intervention teacher have joined cohort 4 (term 2) to upskill their knowledge and teaching practices to incorporate elements of SL where appropriate to their literacy programme.

- Apply for cohort 5 SL PLD for the junior staff.
- Visit an additional school using writers tool box


