# Mid-year student achievement and progress report:

We're pleased to report that learning at school is having a positive impact across all areas of the school. We all can imagine the impact that the last 2 years of disrupted school attendance, hybrid learning and other interventions have had on all students. We have noticed that it took until the end of Term 2 for the culture of the school to return to what it has been pre Covid19, with many of the junior students experienced assemblies for the first time in their education. Whilst the wave of covid that went through in Term 1 and the cold and flu in Term 2. attendance rates remained somewhat ok with most weeks seeing mid-80% attendance. This has allowed the teachers and students to really work hard to be as deliberate as possible maximising the opportunities to make progress across the whole school from the start of the year. Writing saw the biggest gains with a 30% increase in students meeting their end-of-year expected learning level, maths has seen an 18% improvement and reading has an 11% improvement. This accelerated shift in student achievement has the school on track to achieve at the levels we saw pre covid.

Mid Year Reading = 86% where they need to be at the end of the year

Mid Year Writing = 70% where they need to be at the end of the year

Mid Year Maths = 88% where they need to be at the end of the year

# Health and Physical Education (HPE) including Relationships and Sexuality Education survey:

Every 2 years we consult with the comunity around what aspects of the HPE curriculum are important to include in our localised delivery for our students. The New Zealand Curriculum now includes "Relationships and Sexuality Education" across all levels of schooling. 
### Manga O Tama Planting Day:

### Puahue Hall Renovation Project Update

We did it!!!!!!!!! The Puahue Hall Association committee is thrilled to announce that we have reached our target to commence renovation of the community hall. There's an upgraded Hall coming our way very soon!!

The purpose of this update is to ensure the School community remain aware of the Project and the impact the building works will have on the school surroundings. We are grateful to Scott and the school team for their understanding as we embark on this Project. The teaching staff are comfortable with a bit of short term pain, for long term gain. Thanks also to the Puahue Playcentre group for their understanding.

After a competitive tender process, we have appointed <u>Kelvin Lalich Builders</u> to be our main contractor. We have been impressed with Kelvin and his team's understanding of our Project. They appreciated that the tender process would be a bit protracted due to our need to secure funding through multiple applications to philanthropic and community funders. Kelvin and the team recognise that we want to retain as much of the character of the Hali as possible, while upgrading and future-proofing the facility, within a tight budget — no small feat! We are so pleased to be working with Kelvin and his team on this important community Project — and we think they are looking forward to the challenge too!

### Things the school community need to know

- The Puahue Community Hall will be unavailable to the school and public from early September due to building works
- The school have been fully consulted on this, and are supportive
- The important memorabilia and school and community assets will be removed from the Hall and stored safely during the building programme
- You'll start to see increased activity around the Hall site from early September
- We are hopeful that the refurbishment will be completed early in term 1 weather and building supply chain permitting
- There will be a small fenced-off area initially, which will grow to the area marked on the plan (attached) as the job progresses. This area is out of bounds to the public and school community
- Most of the lower carpark will be able to be used. There will be minimal impact to the drop
  off and pick up traffic flow
- Once the building project is complete, we will work with the school and our wonderful community families to explore car park re-sealing options
- Access to Playcentre shouldn't be affected by the building programme
- We continue to welcome all offers of community support to conclude this project, so please feel free to get in touch!
